The Parts Of A Plant

Stem – necessary for movement

It keeps the plant upright and slowly turns it towards the light during the day when the sun moves. It also carries water and minerals to the rest of the plant.

Roots – necessary for <u>nutrition</u> These anchor the plant and soak up water and minerals from the soil. Flower – necessary for reproduction
It is colourful and smells nice which attracts insects.

Leaves – necessary for <u>nutrition</u> The chlorophyll in the green leaves uses sunlight to change carbon dioxide gas and water into food. The process is called photosynthesis.
